


Romans 5:17 (NLT)



Where Jesus' gift and the Holy Spirit's fruit collide, we encounter a perfect blend of love, wisdom, and power - a sound mind.


FOUR QUALITIES THAT JESUS REFLECTS AND REFRACTS



THE EVER PRESENCE OF THE FATHER Psalms 139:7 (NLT)


THE FATHER'S MERCY 1 John 1:9 (NLT)

He does not just issue a stay to our execution, He offers a complete divine pardon!




GOD IS <u>GRACIOUS</u> Hebrews 4:16 (NLT)

with divine decorum. He never loses His cool because He knows His way is the only way and so He does not need to get frustrated.




THE FATHER IS LONG-SUFFERING 2 Peter 3:9 (NLT)

The words I speak are not my own, but my Father who lives in me does his work through me. Just believe that I am in the Father and the Father is in me.



He is the Holy Spirit, who leads into all truth. The world cannot receive him, because it isn't looking for him and doesn't recognize him.


But you know him, because he lives with you now and later will be in you.

Because of the Father's ever-presence, His mercy, His graciousness, and His long-suffering Jesus is...




JESUS IS COMMITTED Matthew 28:20 (NLT)

"Teach these new disciples to obey all the commands I have given you. And be sure of this: I am with you always, even to the end of the age."




JESUS IS ENDURANCE Hebrews 12:2 (NLT)


JESUS IS LOGIC (LOGOS) John 1:1 (NLT)

He existed in the beginning with God. God created everything through him, and nothing was created except through him.




JESUS IS LIFE John 1:4 (NLT)

ADDITIONAL STUDY

GOD IS EVER-PRESENT

All creation is dependent upon His presence (Col. 1:17) God's continual presence brings contentment (Heb. 13:5) God is everywhere and no one can escape Him (Ps. 139:7-12) No task is too large or too difficult for Him (Jer. 32:17, 27) One cannot hide from God (Jer. 23:23-24)

JESUS IS PRESENT Matthew 1:23 (NLT)

"Look! The virgin will conceive a child! She will give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel, which means 'God is with us.'"

GOD IS MERCY

God will never relent in showing mercy to His children (Ps. 23:6)

God will listen to our pleas for mercy (Ps. 30:8)

Because of mercy, God washes away our transgressions (Ps. 51:1)

Because God is merciful, He has not hidden from us (Ps. 69:16)

Mercy comes to those who confess their sins (Prov. 28:13)

Mercy is given to those who are themselves merciful (Matt. 5:7)

God desires to show mercy to His people instead of having His people try to obtain their own righteousness (Matt. 9:13)

God shows mercy to those who fear His name (Luke 1:50)

THE SECOND ADAM

Romans 5:12-17 (NLT)

When Adam sinned, sin entered the world. Adam's sin brought death, so death spread to everyone, for everyone sinned. Yes, people sinned even before the law was given. But it was not counted as sin because there was not yet any law to break. Still, everyone died-from the time of Adam to the time of Moses-even those who did not disobey an explicit commandment of God, as Adam did. Now Adam is a symbol, a representation of Christ, who was yet to come. But there is a great difference between Adam's sin and God's gracious gift. For the sin of this one man, Adam, brought death to many. But even greater is God's wonderful grace and his gift of forgiveness to many through this other man, Jesus Christ. And the result of God's gracious gift is very different from the result of that one man's sin. For Adam's sin led to condemnation, but God's free gift leads to our being made right with God, even though we are guilty of many sins. For the sin of this one man, Adam, caused death to rule over many. But even greater is God's wonderful grace and his gift of righteousness, for all who receive it will live in triumph over sin and death through this one man, Jesus Christ.
