The call for believers to be vigilant and spiritually prepared

Separation and Moral Stand

2 Corinthians 6:17 - "Therefore go out from their midst, and be separate from them, says the Lord..."

Separation from worldly influences and the importance of taking a moral stand

Practical Steps for Unprecedented Faith

Philippians 4:6-7 - "Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with

thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God..."

Cultivate unprecedented faith and navigate uncertain times

Engaging in Moral Leadership

Micah 6:8 - "He has told you, O man, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love

kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?"

Take a moral stand in their personal lives and communities

Matthew 24:14 - The state of the church...

LEGALISM.

Legalism: substituting rules for relationships. You will never get to know God's character through rules but rather through relationship.

WORLDLY DISTRACTIONS.

Phillipians 3:7-8 NIV

But whatever was to my profit, I now consider loss for the sake of Christ. What is more, I consider everything a loss

compared to the surpassing greatness of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord, for whose sake I have lost all things. I consider

them rubbish, that I may gain Christ...

SPIRITUAL COMPLACENCY.

Satisfied with what we have done, not what is still to be done.

One of most dangerous things so many churches — spiritually complacent!

Marriage, Ministry, Relationship to God

If you're not dead—you're not done!

Philippians 3:12-14 (From prison!)

Not that I have already obtained all this, or have already been made perfect, but I press on to take hold of that for which

Christ Jesus took hold of me. Brothers, I do not consider myself yet to have taken hold of it. But one thing I do: Forgetting

what is behind and straining toward what is ahead, I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me

heavenward in Christ Jesus.
