Day 3: The Armor of God as Our Divine Protection The armor of God, as described in Ephesians 6, is not composed of our traits but is a divine provision that equips us to stand firm against the schemes of the devil. Each piece of this armor—truth, righteousness, peace, faith, salvation, and the Word of God—represents a characteristic of God that protects us and empowers us to engage in spiritual warfare from a place of victory. Understanding that this armor is provided by God shifts our reliance from our abilities to the Savior, enabling us to confront spiritual challenges with divine strength. [44:03]
